Introduction

Encapsulated in the present volume is a summary of the Board's activities and events that took place during 2020-21. The period saw the virulent spread of Covid 19 pandemic which continues to plague the world, having impacted the lives, livelihoods and lifestyles of millions of people all over the world. The pandemic is a grim reminder of, among other things, the intricate relationship that exists between humans and nature. It is in no uncertain terms a pointer to the need for "Living in Harmony with Nature" and calls for sustained collective efforts to maintain the fragile ecological balance through biodiversity conservation which occupies a pivotal position in this process.

Tamil Nadu is one of the mega bio-diverse states of the country, being endowed with a bounty of rich biodiversity right from coastal marine ecosystems in the Gulf of Mannar to terrestrial evergreen forests in the Western Ghats. Out of the 16809 species of flowering plants in India, Tamil Nadu ranks first in species richness with 5674 taxa. The faunal diversity is also equally impressive which includes 165 species of fresh water fishes, 76 species of amphibians, 177 species of reptiles,454 species of birds and 187 species of mammals.


The rich biodiversity of the state is faced with increasing pressure on account of habitat destruction, degradation, fragmentation, overuse of resources, invasion of alien species, pollution and climate change which threatens to push a number of endemic species to the verge to extinction and seriously impact the ecosystem services which are vital to human existence and well-being. While efforts at biodiversity conservation date back to times immemorial, they have been flagship species centric and area-based approaches, at best. The signing of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) in 1992 signified the world-wide dawning of the realisation that biodiversity has to be conserved and sustainably used across landscapes.

Towards fulfilment of its national commitments as a signatory to the treaty (CBD), India enacted the Biological Diversity Act in the year 2002. Established in 2008 as per section 22 of the Biodiversity Act 2002, the Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board has come a long way. In course of its journey spanning a period of 13 years, the Board has ensured the constitution of Biodiversity Management Committees across the state and preparation of People's Biodiversity Registers, organized training and capacity building programmes for stakeholders involved in the Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS) process, notably the Forest Range Officers (FROs), Block Development Officers (BDOs), District Forest Officers (DFOs) and companies using bio-resources.

Be that as it may, there is still a long way to be traversed before the BMCs are strengthened to become decentralised, grassroot level, self-sustaining institutions for conserving biodiversity on a sustainable basis through community participation, and biodiversity conservation becomes institutionalised and mainstreamed into the planning and programme implementational frameworks of the State. The Board is poised to walk these infant institutions through their teething phase on the path to the envisioned goals, extending necessary handholding support as required.

Genesis of the Board

The Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board was constituted on 29 April 2008 vide G.O. (Ms) No. 38 Environment and Forests (FR-5) Department under Section 22 of the Biological Diversity Act, 2002, with the Hon'ble Minister for Forests as the Chairperson of the Board. Since its constitution, senior IFS officers have been appointed as the Secretaries to the Board. The Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Rules were notified on 9 November 2017 through G.O. Ms. No. 137, Environment and Forest (FR-5). The Rules came into effect from 6 December 2017 after which the Board's activities gathered momentum to achieve new heights.



Functions of the Board

Section 23 of the Biological Diversity Act 2002 states the following functions of the State Biodiversity Board:

- a. Advise the State Government, subject to any guidelines issued by the Central Government, on matters relating to the conservation of biodiversity, sustainable use of its components and equitable sharing of the benefits arising out of the utilization of biological resources;
- b. Regulate by granting of approvals or otherwise, requests for commercial utilization or biosurvey and bio-utilization of any biological resource by Indians;
- c. Perform such other functions as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act or as may be prescribed by the State Government.

Rule 13 of the Tamil Nadu Biological Diversity Rules 2017 states the following 27 functions:

- i. lay down the procedure and guidelines to regulate the activities provided under Section 7 of the Act; .
- ii. advise the Government, subject to any guidelines issued by the Central Government, on any matter concerning conservation of biodiversity, sustainable use of its components and fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of the use of biological resource and knowledge;
- iii. provide livelihood support to those villagers, who have shifted or are in the process of shifting from unsustainable livelihoods to sustainable livelihoods or as Trekking Service Providers;
- iv. promote and strengthen individuals and institutions who are already working towards conservation, sustainable use and equitable benefit sharing of biological resources;
- v. provide technical assistance and guidance to various departments of the Government in connection with implementation of provisions of the Act;
- vi. regulate by granting of approvals or otherwise, requests for commercial utilisation or bio-survey and bio-utilisation of any biological resources under the Act by Indians;
- vii. facilitate updating and implementation of State Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan;
- viii. commission studies and sponsor investigations and research; ,
- ix. engage consultants, for specific period, not exceeding three years, for providing technical assistance to the Board in the effective discharge of its functions;
- collect, compile and publish technical and statistical data, manuals, codes or guides relating to conservation of biological diversity, sustainable use of its components and fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of the use of biological resource and knowledge;
- xi. organise through mass media, a comprehensive programme regarding conservation of biological diversity, sustainable use of its components and fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of the use of biological resources and knowledge:
- xii. plan and organise training of personnel engaged or likely to be engaged in programmes for the conservation of biological diversity and sustainable use of its components;
- xiii. prepare the annual budget of the Board incorporating its own receipts and also the funds or grants from the Central Government, State Government and National Biodiversity Authority:

Provided that such allocation by the Central Government or State Government or National Biodiversity Authority shall be operated in accordance with the budget provisions approved by the Central Government or State Government or National Biodiversity Authority, as the case may be;

- xiv. approve the en-bloc sanction of the annual budget and work programme;
- xv. recommend to the Government, for creation of posts of the officers and employees of the Board for effective discharge of the functions by the Board and to create such posts, provided that no such post whether permanent, temporary or of any nature, shall be created without prior approval of the Government;
- xvi. approve the method of recruitment to the officers and employees of the Board;
- xvii. take steps to build up database and to create information and documentation system for biological resources and associated traditional knowledge through biodiversity registers

and electronic databases, to ensure effective management, promotion and sustainable use;

- xviii. give advice and directions to the local bodies, Biodiversity Management Committees in writing for effective implementation of the Act and to facilitate their meaningful participation in all measures relating to conservation, sustainable use and equitable benefit sharing;
- xix. report to the Government about the functioning of the Board and implementation of the Act and the rules made thereunder;
- xx. devise methods to ensure protection of rights including intellectual property rights over biological resources and associated knowledge including systems of maintaining confidentiality of such information as appropriate, including the protection of the information recorded in People's Biodiversity Registers;
- xxi. sanction grants-in-aid and grants to Biodiversity Management Committees for specific purposes;
- xxii. undertake physical inspection of any activity or work to check whether it is in accordance with the provisions of the Act;
- xxiii. ensure that biodiversity and biodiversity-dependent livelihoods are integrated into all sectors of planning and management, and at all levels of planning from local to State, to enable such sectors and administrative levels to contribute effectively to conservation and sustainable use;
- xxiv. award individually or as a group, or both for innovation and contribution in the biodiversity sector of the State;
- xxv. formulate guidelines to the settlement of disputes between the Biodiversity Management Committees and to evaluate the performance of the Biodiversity Management Committees and annually reward the best performing Biodiversity Management Committee at each level in the State;
- xxvi. recommend in consultation with the local bodies for notifying the areas of biodiversity importance as biodiversity heritage sites under sub-section (1) of Section 37 of the Act and for the management and conservation of the heritage sites;
- xxvii. perform such other functions as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of the Act or as may be assigned or directed by the Government from time to time.



Expert Committee on Access & Benefit Sharing

TNBB receives applications for access to biological resources under several sections of the Act, either directly or through the National Biodiversity Authority (NBA). This Committee processes these applications to either recommend or return them. Once recommended, ABS agreements are signed between the applicant and TNBB to ensure that the received benefits are shared with the providers of biological resources.

Expert Committee on "BMC Constitution and Documentation of PBRs"

Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs) are the ground-level institutional structures formed under the Biological Diversity Act, 2002. BMCs have important roles and functions under the Act, such as ensuring local biodiversity conservation, sustainable use of bio-resources within their jurisdiction and the documentation of People's Biodiversity Registers (PBRs) which is a dynamic record of all biological resources and associated traditional knowledge and knowledge holders within the jurisdiction of the BMCs. This Committee oversees the constitution of BMCs and the preparation of PBRs by BMCs. It also supports BMCs with their functioning, through trainings and workshops as required.

BHS committee meeting on 28.12.2020

Meeting highlights:

- Dr. C. P. Rajkumar and Dr. D. Narasimhan explained the site features of three sites namely Arittapatti, Madurai; Vagaikulam, Tirunelveli and TNAU Coimbatore where they have completed the field visits for evaluation, out of a total of 10 sites in Tamil Nadu.
- Field visits to the other seven sites will be undertaken and duly reported.
- The Chairperson highlighted the importance of obtaining consent from the respective land owners of the above-mentioned sites viz. Arittapatti, Madurai, Vagaikulam, Tirunelveli and TNAU, Coimbatore as it is essential for declaring any site as a BHS. He further added that appropriate procedure be followed to obtain prior consent from respective land/site owners.
- With respect to Arittapatti, the ownership is with Tamil Nadu Minerals Limited (TAMIN), Archaeology Department and the Panchayat. No objection certificate would be obtained from the above-mentioned Departments / Panchayat by the TNBB before the public hearing to notify Arittapatti as a BHS site in Tamil Nadu.
- In the case of Vagailkulam Tank, the tank belongs to 3 Panchayats (3 BMCs) though owned by Public Works Department (PWD). The Chairman opined that the initially the concerned Chief Engineer should be informed about the proposed notification of Vagailkulam Tank as BHS and later a meeting with the Principal Secretary, PWD may be convened for the above purpose. The fish resources have to be documented in the Tank before notifying it as a BHS. ATREE, an NGO in Bangalore has its presence in the site and has been working for a long time along with the M.S. University; hence before the public hearing, the PWD/ATREE may be taken into confidence for notifying the Vagailkulam Tank as BHS.
- With regard to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU) consent is required from the Vice-Chancellor, TNAU. A Committee can be formed with the Director, Plant Genetic Resources as the Chairman and a few members from TNAU to pass a resolution as to which areas in TNAU are to come under the proposed BHS before public hearing and notifying it as BHS.
- Dr. D. Narasimhan, Committee Member opined that with respect to TNAU, there is a clear link with farmers in terms of distribution of seeds and germplasm exchange. In addition, training and dissemination is also undertaken.
- Dr. C. P. Rajkumar, Committee Member, explained that in the case of Arittapatti and Vagaikulam there is a lot of potential for ecotourism. In addition, it supports fishing However, the fishing potential needs to be explored and rights for fishing very clearly understood.

The Secretary TNBB stated that TNBB will follow up with the above-mentioned Departments/Authorities/Institutes for the Notification of the BHS.

Board Meetings

9th Board Meeting – 17.09.2019

Ninth meeting of the Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board was held in the conference hall of 2nd floor, old secretariat building, Secretariat, Chennai – 9

Meeting highlights and key decisions

- It was appreciated in the meeting that the RDPR department, District Administration & the District Nodal Officers (DFOs) had taken suitable and concerted efforts to constitute the BMCs in time and the KP/TSG members had played a vital role in compiling/sharing the information and the Senior scientists & the Research Assistants of the Task Force and the Board had worked tirelessly in a very professional manner for the preparation of PBR.
- Reconstitution of the Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board members As per G.0 (Ms). No. 14 Environment and Forests Department (FR-5) Department dated 31.01.2017, the Tenure of the Non-Official Member had expired on 31.01.2020. The Government reconstituted the TNBB vide in the G.0 (Ms). No. 8 Environment and Forests Department (FR-5) Department dated 28.01.2020.
- **TNBB Office Space, and Staff requirements –** The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Department) assured that necessary action would be taken to allot Office space to TNBB in Panagal Maaligai, Saidapet, Chennai 15.
- **Staff requirement** The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Head of Department) assured that necessary action will be taken to depute adequate Staff to TNBB to fill up the vacant positions.
- The Board accepted the proposal for seeking necessary financial support from the Government for the purpose of training & capacity building of stakeholders (Rs 50 Lakhs) on Biological Diversity Act, 2002 and to carry out study and research on vulnerable species of flora and fauna in the entire State for the purpose of conservation (Rs 75 lakhs).
- The Hon'ble Minister instructed that funds available with Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Department should be utilised for Biodiversity Conservation through the Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board.

The preparation of draft PBR has been completed successfully for BMCs at all levels, both Urban (Corporation, Municipality, Town Panchayat) and Rural (District, Block, Village). Validation of the PBRs by the respective Biodiversity Management Committees is in progress.

ePBRs

Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board is in the process of digitizing the Peoples Biodiversity Registers that have been prepared. The data collected is being uploaded in BIOMIS (Biodiversity Management Information System) portal.

Preparation of "Peoples Biodiversity Registers" under Special Component Plan for SC

An amount of 25 lakhs was sanctioned for documentation of Peoples Biodiversity Registers by the National Biodiversity Authority for 16 Block Level BMCs which are identified as having more than 40% SC population. A fund of Rs 35000 has been released to each one of the 16 BMCs.

Teams from TNBB visited the BMCs in the districts of Cuddalore, Kancheepuram, The Nilgiris, Thiruvarur and Nagapattinam during the months of January, February and March 2021 for activating the BMCs and to sensitize and enlighten the members on the updation of PBR.



PBRs Prepared under TNBB-GIZ ABS Partnership Project

The TNBB-GIZ ABS Partnership project supported 12 model BMCs in Tamil Nadu in 10 districts, namely Chengam (Tiruvannamalai district), Kariapatti (Virudhunagar district), -Mandapam (Ramanathapuram district), Melur and Sedapatti (Madurai district), Natham and Shanarpatti (Dindigul district), Periyakulam (Theni district), Radhapuram (Tirunelveli district), Thiruporur (Chengalpattu district), Thirrupuvanam (Sivagangai district), Thiruvattar (Kanniyakumari district). A comprehensive People's Biodiversity Register was prepared in each of these model BMCs by Covenant Centre for Development (CCD) with the co-ordination and involvement of BMC members, local people, native healers & holders of traditional knowledge and other resource persons in the locality. Apart from the 31 formats specified for PBR, additional information such as Trader/Agency details, Value chain of the bio-resource and stakeholder details have also been captured and documented in the prepared PBRs.

The Member Secretary, in consultation with the ex-officio members of the Committee shall nominate the members in S. No.9, 10, 11 and 12 and their term will be two years.

Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS)

Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board receives applications for access to bio-resources under two sections of the Biological Diversity Act, 2002-Section 3 and Section 7. Users who are non-Indians or organisations with non-Indian participation submit their requests for access to bio resources to the National Biodiversity Authority (NBA) under Section 3, whereas users or user organisations registered in India apply directly to the respective State Biodiversity Board (TNBB). NBA forwards applications under Section 3 to TNBB for their recommendations. NBA also forwards applications under Section 6 of the Biological Diversity Act, 2002 dealing with intellectual property rights to TNBB when necessary. TNBB also receives ABS applications as per Rule 15 of Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Rules, 2017. Under this Rule, TNBB has received 5 Form-1 applications and these ABS applications are being processed. The following table depicts the details of applications received and processed as well as the funds received and distributed.

Distribution of ABS funds

An agreement was signed between Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board and M/s iSERA Biological Pvt Ltd, Pune on 17th December 2019 with benefit sharing obligation agreed at 5% of the purchase price of the snake venom for three years for procuring Lyophilized form of Venom from Irula Snake Catchers Industrial Co-operative Society Ltd, Kancheepuram for manufacturing anti snake venom. iSERA Biological Pvt Ltd made the upfront payment of Rs. 17,700 to the Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board in January 2020. 95% of this amount (Rs. 16815) was then handed over to the benefit claimers - the "Irula Snake Catchers Industrial Cooperative Society Ltd, Thiruporur" who were identified as benefit claimers in the presence of the ABS Expert Committee of Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board, District Forest Officer, Chengalpattu Forests Division, Kancheepuram District (Nodal officer), Members of Biodiversity Management Committee (BMC), Thiruporur and the Secretary, Irula Snake Catchers Industrial Cooperative Society Ltd, Thiruporur in a meeting held on 17 November 2020. The amount so received will be used by the benefit claimers as per the provisions of the Act and the Rules.



Expert committee visit to evolve modalities for benefit sharing from the royalty amount received from the exporters of Seaweed, Southern Coastal Districts of Tamil Nadu

Background

The Biological Diversity (BD) Act regulates Access and Benefit Sharing (ABS) through its Section 21(2). Section 27 of the BD Act specifies that the fund accrued under the National Biodiversity Fund can be utilized for (a) Channelizing benefits to the benefit claimers; (b) Conservation and promotion of Biological Resources; (c) Socio-economic development.

In the present case, the NBA had received a royalty amount of Rs. 43, 57,176 from the exporters (PepsiCo India Holding, Gurgaon and Ganesan & Sons, Tuticorin). After deducting the TDS and the administrative charges (2.5 %), the NBA transferred an amount of Rs. 37, 14, 277 to the TNBB through its Sanction order dated 31st March 2017. An amount of Rs. 92,857 was deducted towards administrative charges of TNBB and the balance amount of Rs. 36,21,420 is available for benefit sharing. Similarly, the TNBB has directly received the royalty amount of Rs. 1,16,588 from the Sea 6 Energy Private Limited, Tuticorin towards the commercial utilization of seaweed for local consumption. An amount of Rs. 5,829 was deducted for administrative charges and TDS and the balance amount of Rs. 1,10,759 is available for benefit sharing. Both these funds were credited to the State Biodiversity Fund (SBF).

Section 27(2) of the BD Act specifies that the accrued funds can be utilized for the direct benefit of the fishing community, conservation purposes, and socio-economic benefits in consultation with the local Biodiversity Management Committees (BMCs). Since the local BMCs were not established then (during 2010), the amount was available in the National Biodiversity Fund (NBF) of NBA. During the year 2017, the State notified the TN Biological Diversity Rules and the BMCs were constituted at the Panchayat level. Hence the total royalty amount of Rs. 37, 32, 179 available with the TN SBB can be utilized for the benefit of the coastal community. The royalty amount was calculated based on the quantum of bioresources accessed from each village. Table 2 provides details of production of seaweed, percentage of share and the total amount available for undertaking socio-economic activities as decided based on the discussions with the BMC members. The maximum benefit-sharing amount of Rs.33,57,336 is available for the Ramanathapuram district and the benefit-sharing amount is calculated based on the quantum of dry seaweed sold by the SHG cultivators to the buyer from each district.

The Expert Committee and its constitution

The TNBB constituted an Expert Committee (EC) for evolving modalities for Benefit Sharing (ABS) on 17.11.2020 consisting of following members:

- Prof.D.Narasimhan Chairman of the Expert Committee Member, Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board
- 2. Dr. E. Patterson Director, Suganthi Devanason Research Institute Thoothukudi
- 3. Dr. V. Arivudai Nambi Independent Expert on Biodiversity
- 4. Dr. B. Sundaramoorthy Dean, Fisheries University, Thoothukudi
- 5. Dr. C. Thomson Jacob Independent Expert on Biodiversity, Formerly Biodiversity Policy Consultant, Centre for Biodiversity Policy and Law, National Biodiversity Authority

Terms of Reference (ToR) for the committee:

- Examine and review the 2010 report prepared by the NBA on Socio-economic study on the cultivators of Sea Weeds in the southern coastal Districts of Tamil Nadu with reference to the Implementation of ABS Provisions of the Biological Diversity Act 2002.
- Undertake field visits to the coastal districts of Thanjavur, Pudukottai, Ramanathapuram and Tuticorin, to meet and discuss with the concerned BMCs, field officials and other stakeholders to evolve modalities for monetary and non-monetary benefit-sharing.

Recommendations of Expert Committee for evolving benefit-sharing modalities

- 5.1 Manora village
- Fixing Reverse Osmosis unit in the local Government school for the benefit of school students
- Tree planting in common lands/open areas/lake and river bunds, notably Palmyrah palm;
- Restoration and desilting village lotus ponds which will help the villagers to grow lotus and trade it to the local buyers; BMCs can levy access fee from the traders;
- The native seaweeds such as VerPasi, KattaKorai and KattiPasi are extensively traded in the local and international market. The trade link needs to be traced out by the SBB/BMCs and the local industries extracting the bioresources should be brought under the compliance mechanism of the BD Act and State Rules.

5.2 Sethubavachatram village

- Value addition techniques such as pickle making, smoking, and drying can be taught to the SHG women for increasing their livelihood options;
- Skill development programs such as hygienic handling of fish, cultivation of native seaweed can be promoted;
- Fixing Reverse Osmosis unit at the PLF Building for the benefit of the SHG women.

5.3 Manalmelkudi

- Ammapettaipanchayat Seaweed drying yard / thatched roof and godown for storing dried seaweed nearer to the cultivation site;
- Solar lights and solar driers for drying seaweed; Infrastructural facilities for extracting carrageenan/agar plant for value addition through technology transfer;
- Construction of shed on the shore for drying seaweed.

5.4. Mimisal

- Capacity building and awareness programs on Biological Diversity Act, Constitution of BMCs and their roles and responsibilities, Preparation of PBRs for the benefit of BMCs, Government officials, Panchayat leaders etc;
- The native seaweeds/seagrasses like KattaPasi. VerPasi, KoraiPasi and KodiPasiare
 widely available in these areas and the local varieties can be extensively promoted by the
 SHGs. The BMCs need to be strengthened in the coastal areas for conserving the coastal
 bioresources and also for regulating the exploitation of the native seaweed by the local
 traders;
- Restoration of degraded freshwater inland wetlands/lakes/ponds/temple tanks can be carried out with the help of PWD and the indigenous fish species can be extensively promoted in these inland water bodies for sustaining the livelihood of the local community;
- Co-management practice can be promoted by the BMC by joining hands with the Fisheries department.

5.5 Olaikuda

- Construction of thatched roof, and provision of solar lamps and torch lights
- Expanding PHC and providing adequate facilities in the Government hospitals and schools.

5.6 Mandapam

- Thangachimadam: promote alternative livelihood option through the establishment of a medicinal plant nursery and to facilitate buy-back arrangement;
- Pamban: Thatched roof/shed for drying seaweed and a light tower on the shore;
- Akkamadam: Sea Weed Seed Bank for growers; native seaweed can be extensively promoted and incentive should be given to the cultivators of native seaweed.

5.7 Thoothukudi

- Capacity building and awareness programs on Biological Diversity Act, Constitution of BMCs and their roles and responsibilities, Preparation of PBRs for the benefit of BMCs, Government officials, Panchayat leaders etc;
- Construction of a thatched roof /shed for seaweed growers;
- To provide required Infrastructural facilities for local schools and hospitals; To provide thermocol mini boats (cost around Rs. 5,000) to the local fishermen.


Visits to the Board by experts, important persons
